## Preventing and Managing Pressure Injuries



In Queensland, the prevalence of hospital-acquired pressure injuries

has fallen from 4.1% in 2015 (from 7.9% in 2011)

#### **Blood and Blood Products**



The national rate of central line-associated bloodstream infections in intensive care units

almost halved between 2012–13 and 2013–14.

# Recognising and Responding to Clinical Deterioration in Acute Health Care



Cardiac arrest rates in NSW public health facilities and Victorian hospitals have fallen significantly since 2010

## Preventing and Controlling Healthcare- Associated Infections



The number of methicillin-resistant Staphylococcus aurues (MRSA) bacteraemia cases occuring in Australian public hospitals

fell from 505 in 2010 to 389 in 2015, a 22.9% reduction

#### **Medication Safety**



#### 73% reduction

in serious medication incidents in South Australia between 2011 and 2015
